The List of the Dead

These are the known names and details of those who died trying to obtain sanctuary in Europe or the UK in July 2024. We share them here so as to honour their lives and mourn the injustice of their deaths; we remember also the many whose deaths remain unrecorded.

Date	Details
1/7	162 people drowned when their boat capsized off Ndiago (Mauritania) on their way to the Canaries (Spain). 9 others survived.
3/7	A man from Afghanistan, aged 28, died in hospital after he was stabbed in an Asylum centre in Krefeld (DE).
4/7	23 people from Morocco and sub-Saharan Africa drowned on their way to Spain when their boat capsized off Casablanca (Morocco). 22 others survived.
6/7	19 people on their way to Europe, including children of 10 and 16, got lost and starved in the Belguebbour desert (Algeria) after they were pushed back by Libya.
7/7	Youssef, aged 17, and 2 others drowned when their boat from Tunisia sank during its landing at Lampedusa (Italy). 44 others survived.
	A man from North Africa, aged 20, drowned while attempting to swim from Morocco.
8/7	A man, aged 28, from Ethiopia died in a fire in a refugee shelter in Buchholz in der Nordheide (DE). 20 others were injured.
9/7	8 people drowned when their life raft hit rocks off Oinousses (Greece) after a push back by Greek Coast Guards. 19 others survived.
10/7	A person died of unknown causes. Their body was recovered from the Mediterranean Sea off Lampedusa (Italy).
11/7	16 people drowned off the coast of Marsa Della (Libya) in the Mediterranean Sea while attempting to reach Europe. 15 others survived.
	A person died of unknown causes. Their body was found in the Mediterranean Sea off Lampedusa (Italy).
12/7	16 people from Sub-Saharan Africa missing, presumed drowned, after their boat got lost in the Mediterranean Sea while attempting to travel from Algeria to the Balearic Islands (Spain).

	Mohamed, Gissam, Jonathan, Ammanuel, Abdallah Ahmad Huseyn, Ahmed Salaad, Ibrahim Huseen, Abdul Rani, and Abdiqani Mohamoud all drowned attempting to reach Britain when their boat deflated off Boulogne-sur-Mer (France). 56 others survived.
13/7	A person died of unknown causes. Their body was found in the Mediterranean Sea off Lampedusa (Italy).
16/7	A man (aged 20) and a girl (aged 2) from Sub-Saharan Africa died of exhaustion in hospital in the Canaries after travelling for 7 days in a boat from Senegal to El Hierro. 49 others survived.
17/7	Dakhlac, a woman from Eritrea aged 32, died of unknown causes. She was found unconscious in a boat off Gravelines (France) on its way to Britain. 71 others survived.
19/7	Abdelaziz Shomo Mohammed from Sudan, aged 15, died of unknown causes on their way to Britain. Their body was found on a sinking boat off Calais (France). 85 others survived.
22/7	210 people from Sub-Saharan Africa drowned off the coast of Nouakchott (Mauritania) on their way to the Canaries. 90 others survived.
23/7	62 people from Nigeria died in a vehicle accident near Madama (Niger) while crossing the Sahara desert on their way to Europe.
25/7	50 people from Western Africa died of unknown violence near Séguédine (Niger) while crossing the Sahara desert on their way to Europe.
28/7	Dina Al Shammari, a woman of 21 from Kuwait, died in hospital in Boulogne-sur-Mer (France) after she was crushed in an overcrowded boat on the way to Britain. 34 others survived.
29/7	Mohamed Abouzayd, an 11 year old boy from Libya, died of a cardiac arrest in France a day after returning from an attempt to cross the English Channel.
31/7	34 people, including 2 children, drowned in the Mediterranean near Bouri Oil Field, north of Zuwara (Libya) on their way to Europe. 2 survived. 44 people from Sub-Saharan Africa, including 1 child, drowned on their way from
	Sfax (Tunisia) to Lampedusa (Italy) when their boat sank. 1 survived.

All: Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

Reflection by Brother Johannes

Prayers of Intercession

Everyone present reads in turn. All say the **response** in bold.

We pray for the thousands of men, women and children, known and unknown, who set out to seek safety and a better life in Europe, but who were drowned in the Mediterranean, the Atlantic, the Aegean, or the English Channel, and for those who mourn them. O Lord hear our prayer, **and let our cry come unto you**.

We pray for migrants who have met hostility or violence from authorities or vigilantes. We pray for those pushed back into the sea, those forced into the desert, and for those who commit these crimes. O Lord hear our prayer, **and let our cry come unto you**.

We pray for the protection of all people in refugee camps in Calais and elsewhere and the communities they build. O Lord hear our prayer, **and let our cry come unto you**.

We pray for refugees arriving in the UK and being placed in detention in poor conditions at arrival, and those made homeless on being granted asylum. We pray for their mental and physical well-being and for the recognition of their right to decent housing. We pray for Ibrahima Bah and all imprisoned people. O Lord hear our prayer, **and let our cry come unto you**.

We pray for the Home Secretary Yvette Cooper, those working in this building, and all others who work to maintain border regimes, that they will be guided by their conscience to change policy. We pray for the end of the hostile environment, and the creation of safe, legal routes for people anywhere to claim asylum in this country. We pray also for all of those detained or deported by the American government. O Lord hear our prayer, **and let our cry come unto you**.

We pray for a resolution to the conflicts and oppression which displace people, for the end of the arms trade, and the realisation of the right of people to remain in their homes. We pray for the realisation of the right of return for all Palestinian refugees. We pray for the people of Congo, Iran,

Afghanistan, Iraq, Syria, Eritrea, Sudan, Ukraine, and Russia. O Lord hear our prayer, **and let our cry come unto you.**

We pray for those who are fleeing the effects of climate change, rising sea levels, drought, flood or crop failure; for those who make decisions about compensation, and those who continue to exploit the earth for profit. We ask forgiveness for our complicity in this. O Lord hear our prayer, and let our cry come unto you.

We pray for the safety and success of those serving aboard the rescue ships: the *Safira*, the *Nihayet*, the *Solidaire*, the *Sarah*, the *Maldusa*, the *Life Support*, the *Mission Lifeline*, the *ResQ*, the *Imara*, the *Nadir*, the *Humanity I*, the *Ocean Viking*, the *Louise Michel*, and others; of the volunteers of the Alarm Phone; and of all activists working against borders. O Lord hear our prayer, **and let our cry come unto you**.

We pray that you create in all of us the strength and resilience to resist unjust immigration laws and to support one another in this struggle. O Lord hear our prayer, **and let our cry come unto you**.
